Re: State Energy Program Assurances

Dear Secretary Chu:

As a condition of receiving our State's share of the \$3.1 billion funding for the State Energy Program (SEP) under the American Recovery and Renewal Act of 2009 (H.R. 1)(ARRA), I am providing the following assurances.

I have written to our public utility commission and requested that it consider additional actions to promote energy efficiency, consistent with the Federal statutory language contained in H.R. 1 and its obligations to maintain just and reasonable rates, while protecting the public.

As set forth in the attached letter, the Chairperson of the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin has informed me that the Commission will take the appropriate steps provided under H.R. 1.

I have also written to the Secretary of the Wisconsin Department of Commerce and requested that he consider actions to improve building energy codes, consistent with State law and State constitutional requirements, and to consider the statutory language contained in ARRA.


We are prioritizing our energy investments to take advantage of existing programs and expand programs where appropriate.
